Jeanne Phillips (/ ʔ d? i? n i /; born 1942), also known as Abigail Van Buren, is an American advice columnist who has written for the advice column Dear Abby. She is the daughter of Pauline Esther "Popo" Phillips, who founded Dear Abby in 1956, and her husband, Morton Phillips.. In a Dear Abby column on December 12, 2000, Pauline introduced Jeanne as co-creator of Dear Abby. Pauline Esther "Popo" Phillips (née Friedman; July 4, 1918 – January 16, 2013), also known as Abigail Van Buren, was an American advice columnist and radio show host who began the Dear Abby column in 1956. During her decades writing the column, it became the most widely syndicated newspaper column in the world, syndicated in 1,400 newspapers with 110 million readers.
